MICAH 5:2-5a

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from vou shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old. from ancient days. Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labour has brought forth: then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel.
