Christmastide and Epiphany

The Gathering

In the name of the Father, † and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Greeting

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Prayer of Preparation

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayers of Penitence

(From Christmas until the Eve of the Epiphany)

Hear the words of the angel to Joseph: 'You shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' Therefore let us seek the forgiveness of God through Jesus the Saviour of the world.

(From the Epiphany until the Eve of the Presentation)

The grace of God has dawned upon the world through our Saviour Jesus Christ, who sacrificed himself for us to purify a people as his own. Let us confess our sins.

(The Presentation of Christ in the Temple)

Hear the words of our Saviour Jesus Christ: 'I am the light of the world.

Whoever follows me shall never walk in darkness but shall have the light of life.'
Let us therefore bring our sins into his light and confess them in penitence and faith.

Confession

Lord of grace and truth, we confess our unworthiness to stand in your presence as your children. We have sinned: **forgive and heal us.**

The Virgin Mary accepted your call to be the mother of Jesus. Forgive our disobedience to your will. We have sinned: **forgive and heal us.**

Your Son our Saviour was born in poverty in a manger. Forgive our greed and rejection of your ways. We have sinned: **forgive and heal us.**

The shepherds left their flocks to go to Bethlehem.
Forgive our self-interest and lack of vision.
We have sinned: **forgive and heal us.**

The wise men followed the star to find Jesus the King.
Forgive our reluctance to seek you.
We have sinned: forgive and heal us.

Absolution

May Almighty God, who sent his Son into the world to save sinners, bring you his pardon † and peace, now and forever. **Amen.**

The Gloria

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Collect

The Collect is said, and all respond Amen.

Old Testament Reading

At the end of each the reader may say: For the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading

Here follows the Gospel Acclamation,

(From Christmas until the Eve of the Epiphany)

Alleluia, alleluia.

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory. **Alleluia.**

(From Epiphany until the Eve of the Presentation)

Alleluia, alleluia.

Christ was revealed in flesh, proclaimed among the nations and believed in throughout the world. **Alleluia.**

(The Presentation of Christ in the Temple)

Alleluia, alleluia.

This child is the light to enlighten the nations, and the glory of your people Israel. **Alleluia.**

then as the Gospel is announced the reader says:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

The Gospel Reading concludes with:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

Affirmation of Faith

Let us declare our faith in God. We believe in God the Father,

from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high.
We believe in one God;
Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Prayers of Intercession (Prayers for those both near and far.)

The Peace

(From Christmas until the Eve of the Epiphany)

Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given, and his name shall be called the Prince of Peace.

(From Epiphany until the Eve of the Presentation)

Our Saviour Christ is the Prince of Peace.

Of the increase of his government and of peace there shall be no end.

(The Presentation of Christ in the Temple)

In the tender mercy of our God the dayspring from on high has broken upon us, to give light to those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Offertory Prayer

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life.

Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this wine to offer, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become for us the cup of salvation.

Blessed be God for ever.

The Eucharistic Prayer (Prayer B)

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

(Extended Proper Preface or)

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us; he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us; and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

(or a Short Proper Preface)

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, St. John the Baptist and all the saints, may praise and glorify you forever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

Amen.

(From Epiphany until the Eve of the Presentation)

Christ our Lord,
to whom kings bowed down in worship
and offered gifts,
reveal to you his glory
and pour upon you the riches of his grace;
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always. Amen.

(The Presentation of Christ in the Temple)

Christ the Son of God, born of Mary, fill you with his grace to trust his promises and obey his will; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

The Dismissal

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. In the name of Christ. Amen.
